# Age

Population estimates

The mid-2010 population estimates suggest that North East Lincolnshire has 157,300 residents<sup>1</sup>. This indicates a decrease from the population counted in the 2001 census which was recorded as 157,979.<sup>2</sup> The following table illustrates the breakdown of the population of North East Lincolnshire by age band – compared to the national and regional average.



The following graph illustrates the breakdown of the population by age and gender for North East Lincolnshire and England. North East Lincolnshire has a lower proportion of people aged 25-39 compared to England, and a higher proportion in the 60 and over age groups.

## Population projections

The most recent population projections produced by the Office for National Statistics are based on the 2008 mid-year population estimates. They project that the population of North East Lincolnshire will increase by 5.79 per cent by 2033. There are notable differences in the projections for each age group, with the greatest reduction in population projected to be in the 55-59 age group (-15.63 per cent), and the greatest increase projected to be in the 85+ age group (+218.18 per cent)<sup>3</sup>. The chart illustrates the population estimates for children, working age and people of pensionable age.

## Gender

## Population estimates

According to the mid-2010 population estimates 51 per cent of the population in North East Lincolnshire are female and 49 per cent of the population are male. This is the same as the average for England. 75 per cent of the population aged 90 and over in North East Lincolnshire are female. The following table shows the proportion of the population who are male and female by five year age bands.

## Life expectancy

2008-2010 data shows that life expectancy at birth for males is 76.5 years, which is lower than the Yorkshire and the Humber region (77.7 years) and England (78.2). For females life expectancy at birth is 81.8, compared to 81.8 in the Yorkshire and the Humber region and 82.27 in England.<sup>5</sup>

Life expectancy varies considerably within North East Lincolnshire. The department of health profile 2011 states that life expectancy is 10.7 years



lower for men and 8.2 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of North East Lincolnshire than in the least deprived areas.<sup>6</sup>

The graph shows life expectancy at birth for males and females in North East Lincolnshire and England from 1991-1993 to 2008-2010. Life expectancy for both males and females is increasing.

75.7 per cent of people in North East Lincolnshire stated their religion to be Christian; this is slightly higher than the regional and national results. 14.6 per cent of people stated that they had no religion which is in line with both regional and national averages.<sup>7</sup>

## Race

## Population estimates by ethnic group

At the time of the 2001 census 97.52 per cent of the population in North East Lincolnshire stated they were White British<sup>8</sup>. The mid-2009 population estimates by ethnic group estimate that 94 per cent of the population in North East Lincolnshire are White British, compared to 86.8 per cent in the Yorkshire and the Humber region and 82.8 per cent in England.<sup>9</sup>

# **Disability**

## 2001 Census – limiting long-term illness

The table below shows the proportion of the population with a limiting long term illness. A limiting long-term illness is any long-term illness, health problem or disability that limits daily activities or work. North East Lincolnshire has a similar proportion of people with a limiting long-term illness as for the Yorkshire and Humber region as a whole, but higher than national average <sup>10</sup>.

There are differences in the proportion of people with a limiting long-term illness living in the wards of North East Lincolnshire. In East Marsh ward 22 per cent of working-age people stated they had a limiting long-term illness in the 2001 census, compared to 10 per cent of the population in the Wolds ward. <sup>11</sup>

## Annual population survey

The results of the Annual Population Survey for April 2010-March 2011 suggest that 20.5 per cent of the population aged 16-64 in North East Lincolnshire are disabled (20,000 people) compared to 21.8 per cent of the people aged 16-64 in the Yorkshire and Humber region and 20.4 per cent in England (20.2%). 12

## Marriage and civil partnerships

## 2001 Census

At the time of the 2001 census there were 123,100 people aged 16 and over living in North East Lincolnshire. 42.3 per cent of people aged 16 and over were married, 26.6 per cent of people were single and 10.5 per cent of people were divorced. The following table shows the marital status census data for North East Lincolnshire, the Yorkshire and the Humber region and England.
